### Knowledge section updates

Recent additions to the Knowledge section of the ERSO website are:

- Safety Ratings Safety rating systems present impartial information on aspects of traffic system safety. Safety ratings in use today are objective tools for the assessment and improvement of aspects of the safety of vehicles, the road network, work-related road safety and international safety performance. - Speed enforcement Speed is at the core of the road safety problem. There is no single solution to the problem of excess and inappropriate speeds. A package of countermeasures is necessary, increasing the effectiveness of each individual measure. Police enforcement is one of the countermeasures. #### Data section updates

Recent additions to the <u>Data section</u> of the ERSO website are <u>Accident statistics</u>. In this section you can find an updated Annual Statistical Report and Traffic Safety Basic Facts based on data from the CARE database.

- Statistical Report The <u>Annual Statistical Report 2007</u> gives a detailed insight into road accident data in up to 18 EU Member States. This report serves as a reference document from which the broader public but also road safety experts are able to retrieve interesting data. The Annual Statistical Report 2007 covers accident data for the period 1996-2005.
- Basic Facts Traffic Safety Basic Facts are delivered in twelve fact sheets (<u>Main Figures</u> <u>Children (Aged <16)</u> <u>Young People (Aged 16-24)</u> <u>The Elderly (Aged >64)</u> <u>Pedestrians</u> <u>Bicycles</u> <u>Motorcycles and Mopeds</u> <u>Car Occupants</u> <u>Heavy Goods Vehicles & Buses</u> <u>Motorways</u> <u>Junctions</u> <u>Urban Areas</u>).
