Knowledge section updates

Recent additions on the Knowledge section of the ERSO website are:

- <u>Powered Two Wheelers</u> With two wheels in line, minimal bodywork and high power to
 weight ratio, PTW's are a economical means of transport. Riding a PTW gives a special
 sensation which is attractive to some groups of riders. Riding a PTW is also much more
 dangerous than using another motor vehicle. Read more about the use and the safety of

- <u>eSafety</u> eSafety is defined here as a vehicle-based intelligent safety systems which could
 improve road safety in terms of exposure, crash avoidance, injury reduction and post-crash

 'eSafety' measures, the knowledge about which is slowly evolving, including information on
